

INVESTED IN OUR INFRASTRUCTURE

Thanks to amazing partners and supporters like you, LIFT-UP was able to expand our infrastructure to meet the nearly 600% growth in clients during COVID and the sustained **300% growth** in food security needs as compared to pre-pandemic demand.

EXPANDED THE FARM TO FOOD PANTRY PROGRAM

LIFT-UP increased access to fresh. local produce, meat and dairy while helping to sustain our local economy by sourcing from over 25 regional farms and ranches.


ADJUSTED FOOD DISTRIBUTIONS

WHERE LIFT-UP IS GOING

LIFT-UP is happy to share that we are **re-opening** our fixed pantries-of-choice, meaning that clients will be able to return to pantries to choose their nonperishable and fresh items. In addition, we have learned that many clients also like the convenience of the drive-thru mobile sites, so we are continuing to offer both methods for accessing food.

The Aspen, New Castle and Carbondale pantries are now open and Glenwood Springs and Rifle will re-open in September.

LIFT-UP is continuing to expand its fresh food options for a healthier community. I am so happy to be able to go back and see the wonderful volunteers at the New Castle pantry. Not only do I get food, both basics and fresh, I get to visit and have social interaction and that is just as important to me.
